### **Academic achievement**

Being from a small village with farming and army background, Sh. Malik graduated in 1966. While in active service of Indian Police, he further pursued his academic pursuits and obtained following higher academic qualifications:-

He is also a prolific writer and has authored following two books in addition to writing many articles on contemporary topics both in English and vernacular which were published in the national and international media.

Joined Indian Army as 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant in Rajputana in 1968. Served on Eastern and Western Frontiers i.e. Indo-China and Indo-Pak Border from 1968 to July 1974. Also led successful Commando operations during counter-insurgency operations namely 'OP Cactus Lily' in Mizo Hills during the year 1969-70 and actively participated in 1971 Indo-Pak war by launching Commando Operations on Jassore/Khulna Axis now in Bangladesh.

Served as an Instructor for a period of more than two years in Commando wing of Infantry School Belgaum from 1971 to 1973.

Was an expert in handling of Anti-militant and Anti-terrorist operations.

**Postings, winning of appreciation letters and Medals during Police service since 1974.**

Joined Indian Police Service in 1974 and was adjudged the best outdoor trainee officer. Awarded Maharaja Gold Cup by the Prime Minister of India at NPA Hyderabad. Is credited with an outstanding service record both in Army as well as in the Police department and has served in the following capacities:-

- (i) District Police Chief.
- (ii) 2<sup>nd</sup> in command of State Intelligence set up
- (iii) CID Chief of the State and Security departments.
- (iv) Chief of Railways and anti-terrorist operational wing of Haryana Police.
- (v) Chief of State Anti Corruption department.
- (vi) State Police Chief with additional charge of State Vigilance Bureau and Chairman, Haryana Police Housing Corporation.

While serving in various capacities in the department, his services have been duly commended/appreciated by the State Govt. and Govt. of India on account of his exceptional/outstanding performance in the maintenance of law and order, handling of anti-terrorist operations, modernization of Police force and keeping up of high morale of the entire State Police force through introduction of innovative ideas and new schemes for the welfare of police personnel and their families.

On account of his unblemished service record during the entire span of 35 years of service, he was awarded following medals by the Government of India:-

- i. Police medal for Meritorious Services on Independence Day, 1986.
- ii. Presidents Police Medal for Distinguished Services on the occasion of Republic Day, 2002.

**In addition to above,**

- ❖ While posted as Addl. S. P. Gurgaon, saved four children from drowning in heavy flood water of river 'Sabi" without caring for this own life and safety, for which his services were duly appreciated by the State Government,
- ❖ As District Police Chief, was able to handle law and order situation effectively.
- ❖ While posted as 2<sup>nd</sup> –in-command of State intelligence set-up in 1979, handled effectively students agitation, Nitrnkari Sammalen and State-wide agitation launched by opposition parties in June 1982.
- ❖ His services were duly appreciated by the State Government in organizing the investigation in gruesome murder of 36 innocent bus passengers near Daryapur (District Hisar) in 1987.

**Steps taken for the Welfare of the men he commanded and modernization of the force.**

During the period of December 2000 to January 2005 when Dr. M.S. Malik was Chief of Haryana Police, State Anti Corruption Department and Chairman of State Police Housing Corporation, took very keen interest in modernization, welfare, training and upgradation of skills and facilities for Haryana Police. With his efforts, 3176 houses were built for constables/head constables in addition to 20 Police Stations, 10 Police Posts and 6 new Police lines. 1482 vehicles of various categories had been purchased for the fleet of Haryana Police. Modern equipment had been acquired for Police training and State Forensic Science laboratory. Under his dynamic leadership, cent percent funds were utilized under the Modernization Scheme. Government of India rated Haryana a top performer in this regard. Rs. 194 Crores were sanctioned and utilized under the Modernization Scheme which brought a sea-change in the performance and working conditions of Haryana Police. Forensic Science Laboratory, Haryana acquired NABL certificate acquiring international standards of scientific investigation.

Strength of Haryana Police was increased manifold during his tenure. Two battalions of India Reserve with the assistance of Government of India and Ch. Devi Lal Centre for Police Training and Research was sanctioned and established in Bhondsi, District Gurgaon. Five battalions of Haryana State Industrial Security Force were raised PCR and Traffic staff for the districts of National Capital Region besides more lady police were sanctioned. By these measures, promotional avenues in all ranks was enhanced and also good Police service to the public at large. Promotion course for Constables to the rank of Head Constable was restarted in his tenure after a gap of four years.

Concessional travel facilities for ministerial staff of Haryana Police and poor class- IV employees of Haryana Police was introduced.

Was always concerned about improving the efficiency, training and welfare of Police officers and officials. Has been instrumental in up-grading physical and educational standards of Constables. Crime rate was reduced to considerable extent during this period. Has the rarest distinction of being an expert in maintenance of law and order, handling of VIP Security, maintenance of public peace, transparency/accountability/eradication of corruption from public offices during his longest and continuous tenure as State Police Chief and also that of State Vigilance Bureau/Anti-corruption department. Led the State Police Force and Anti-corruption machinery with distinction.

### **Retired Life**

He retired from service on 31.10.2006. He now resides at Kothi No. 1023, Sector 27- B in Chandigarh. He remains actively involved in developing sports at national and international level on account of his long and on-going association with multifarious sports and social organizations up to international level.

At the same time, he remains busy in doing social work particularly in creating awareness amongst all section of society and amongst people of all ages on human rights and the law.

He also renders free legal advice to the needy and have-nots as he is also an advocate and member of Punjab and Haryana, High Court Bar Association.
