But all the same going by the ordinary standards of importance, he normally remained what is called 'Khude Line' posting in Haryana but he enjoyed every moment and found that he could contribute richly everywhere except for five months when he was posted as SP, Traffic for Haryana State. Unfortunately, Haryana Police Traffic Wing has never been serious about road safety or control or regulation of traffic. 11	Other notable achievements	<p>As SP Jind, he had introduced free registration in his district in 1976-77 in face of tough opposition from Police Headquarters. The registered crime witnessed steep rise but he explained to Headquarters that he could not abdicate his socio-legal responsibilities for the sake of dead statistics.</p> <p>However, he reaped great advantage that the number of complaints against Police saw an equally steep decline and Police earned appreciation at District Grievances Committee meetings. That strengthened his belief that the biggest malady the Police is suffering from is non-registration of reports and crime.</p> <p>In the State, he brought down the cost of construction, maintaining highest quality in Haryana Police Housing Corporation. The costs in our corporation were the lowest not only in Haryana Govt. but also amongst all the Police Corporations of the country.</p> <p>He led a team of Haryana Police Housing Corporation to quake ravaged Gujarat in 2001 and constructed semi permanent quake resistant structures @ Rs. 95/- square feet as against the prevailing rate of Rs. 240/- per square feet in</p>

		<p>Gujarat Govt. and in the most of NGOs. Moreover, they were the first to enter rural Gujarat for raising semi-permanent structures in that State. Subsequently, he was asked by the Haryana Govt. to liaise with Gujarat Govt. to construct an eight crore ITI complex in the sub divisional town of Rapar where they have been stayed in 2001. Even in the other State with local contractors, the cost of construction was about 33% below their prevailing costs.</p> <p>In CBI where he served for 3 years, he established new standard of integrity in investigations. It was first time in the history of the CBI that when it occurred in investigations, the name of the ruling PM was brought on record as an accused. The Govt. could not compel him and his team to fall in line with them.</p>

21	Advice to members of IPS	<p>Basic job of Police service is to enforce laws truthfully. That is a very tall order when seen in wide spectrum. A few ready tips could be enumerated.</p> <p>i) All the Policemen and the more so the senior Police officers should remain scrupulously honest. There is no substitute for honesty and there is no reason for a Policeman to turn dishonest even if all the other departments of the Govt. are on a looting spree. We must realize that an honest Police can check all the dishonesty not only for other services but of the politicians as well as the Police has the necessary powers.</p> <p>ii) Police officer & men should not indulge in burking or minimizing the crime. It is at once violation of law, the negation of truth, violation of human rights and leads to bad publicity. Nothing has done more damage to Police image than non-registration of crime. The Nithari of U.P. is nothing but result of non registration of crime by the Police.</p> <p>iii) Do not intimidate anybody and much less the victim of the crime who comes with complaint.</p> <p>iv) Be absolutely impartial. People still have faith in the impartial Police officers.</p> <p>v) Whatever discretion the law gives or the interpretation of law permits, use that in favour of the weak. Remember strong can look after himself; the law or in other words the Police should basically look after the legal and truthful rights of the weak.</p>
